

Software License Implementation Guidelines

In accordance with its open access policies, CIP has adopted the **GNU General Public License v.3** to govern the redistribution of its custom software. These license terms ensure that CIP programs and works derived from these programs will remain open source.

Please apply these guidelines to all software that may be distributed publicly or to third parties:

1. The following notice text must be added to the beginning of **each** source file of the program to ensure proper attribution if the code is reused, and to avoid the risk of the code being disconnected from the license terms:
